Guidance for Parents/Carers

When assisting your child with writing tasks you should encourage your child to:

- Use capital letters correctly
- Punctuate their sentences using full stops, exclamation marks, commas and question marks.
- Encourage children to use their phonic knowledge to spell unfamiliar words
- Use interesting vocabulary including adjectives and adverbs to provide detail.
- Write consistently in the correct tense e.g. past, present or future.

When **reading** with your child, be this a school reading book or a book of their choice, you could discuss the following things:

- The meaning of unknown words children can be encouraged to look up words in a dictionary or online.
- How the characters feel.
- Make predictions about what might happen next.
- Where the story is set.
- Their opinion on the story.
- Can they retell the story in their own words?

Guidance for Parents/Carers

In Maths, children have been provided with a range of strategies for solving calculations. This includes:

- Counting on and back (addition & subtraction)
- Repeated addition (multiplication)
- Sharing into equal groups (division)
- Organising numbers into hundreds, tens and ones columns

We encourage children to show their working out when there is more than one step to a problem. This enables them to look back at how they got to that answer and spot any mistakes.

Your child should be able to explain their methods to you and show you their strategies for solving their calculations. This will not only help you to understand their method but will help children to understand and clarify their own learning.
